## Dates in History

476

- On September 4th, Romulus Augustus, the last emperor of the Western Roman Empire, was deposed by Odoacer, a German barbarian who proclaimed himself king of Italy. Although Roman rule continued in the East, the crowning of Odoacer marked the end of the original Roman Empire, which was centered in Italy.
- 1519 On September 20th, Portuguese navigator Ferdinand Magellan set sail from Spain in an effort to find a western sea route to the rich Spice Islands of Indonesia. On October 21, he finally discovered the strait he had been seeking. It took 38 days to navigate the treacherous strait, and when ocean was sighted at the other end, Magellan wept with joy.
- **1813** On September 10th, U.S. Captain Oliver Hazard Perry led a fleet of nine American ships to victory over a squadron of six British warships at the Battle of Lake Erie during the War of 1812. The battle was closely contested for hours, and Perry's flagship, Lawrence was reduced to a defenseless wreck. He then transferred to the Niagara and sailed directly into the British line, firing broadsides and forcing the British to surrender.

**1985** On September 1st, seventy-three years after it sank to the North Atlantic ocean floor, the wreck of the RMS Titanic was found. Efforts to locate and salvage the Titanic began almost immediately after it sank. But technical limitations, as well as the sheer vastness of the North Atlantic search area, made it extremely difficult. The sunken liner was found about 400 miles east of Newfoundland in the North Atlantic, some 13,000 feet below the surface.
